Public Education & Outreach on Stormwater Impacts:

Attended both Marketfest and Harvestfest. A table and display was set up at each event to promote Lawns to Lobsters. A push mower was raffled off at both events. Lawns to Lobsters brochures were handed out to anyone filling out a raffle ticket. There will be a table for Lawns to Lobsters at the polls on November 5th at York High School. The drawing for the lawn mower will be on November 5th and the winning ticket will be drawn by Mary-Anne Szeniewski, Town Clerk.

Attended Hazardous Waste Day at the Public Works Recycling and Compost Facility on Witchtrot Road. Approximately 150 Lawns to Lobsters brochures were handed out.

Public Involvement & Participation:

Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination:

Contacted the 2 remaining property owners to perform a dye test, inspect the homes sewer pipe and inspect the grounds.

Information for an Administrative Inspection Warrant submitted to Town Attorney for property located at 15 Algonac Avenue. Served property owner on October 25th. At the time of service, property owner agreed to let the Town perform a dye test and inspections on October 31st.

Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control:

There are currently no projects with soil disturbance greater than 1 acre.

Post-construction Stormwater Management (New and Redevelopment):

Currently working on erosion and sediment control measures for May 2014.

Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations:

None scheduled for October.
