MS4 Permit Requirements and Meetings for December:

- The York County MS4 Group met on December 4th. I was on vacation that day but did meet a few days later with our consultant to review the 4 Plans discussed at the Group’s meeting. All 4 Plans were submitted to MDEP for review and approval. Three of the Plans have been posted on the MS4 web page, and are as follows: York County MS4 Stormwater Program Management Plan, York County MS4 Targeted BMP Plan, and the York Municipal Awareness Plan.
- The 4th Plan, the Statewide Public Awareness Plan, is being administered by Cumberland County Soil & Water Commission for all 4 statewide MS4 groups. This helps with the total cost of advertising for the towns and cities involved. It will be the yellow ducky TV ad that we’ve all seen before, and will run on several cable channels in the spring of 2014 including Channel 3. Stay tuned!

As I’ve reported in my prior monthly reports, there is an ongoing bacteria issue in the wetland above Cape Neddick Beach, off Wanaque Road. The most recent testing turned up nothing conclusive. I had contacted MDEP enforcement division for help and was told their focus is on opening clam flats. So...since the State couldn’t help me, I contacted Alex Rosenberg with EPA Region 1 in Boston for assistance with this puzzle. My spreadsheet with the most recent testing and the link to previous work done on the Cape Neddick was sent to him. He forwarded the information to Erin Trainor at the EPA lab in Chelmsford MA. Alex indicated EPA will test for pharmaceuticals to determine whether bacteria is human or animal. Haven’t heard anything from either individual, so I’ll be contacting Alex in January to see what up.
