MS4 Permit Requirements and Meetings:

Dylan and I met on February 3rd with Kristie (IEE) to outline what should be in the new Comp Plan Stormwater Chapter, and what format to use. To keep the new chapter in line with existing chapters, it will be modeled after the *Adaptation to Sea Level Rise* section of the Comp Plan. Dylan and I meet with the Town Manager, Steve Burns, discuss having Kristie write the chapter and present it to the Planning Board at two workshops and one public meeting. Town Manager was agreeable. The first Planning Board workshop is scheduled for March 26, 2015.

Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination:

There has been a collaborative effort among Town staff, the Sewer District, and the Town's Stormwater Consultant to review current infrastructure as part of the Town's response to EPA. The Sewer District will televise their pipes in the areas of investigation. On February 23, 2015 the Town requested a one week extension to file its response. The extension was granted on February 2th. New date is March 9, 2015.

On February 18th Kristie and I met with Dr. Steve Jones of UNH, who will be conducting microbial source tracking at the sites. Microbial source tracking can differentiate between human and non-human bacteria.
