MS4 Permit Requirements and Meetings for June:

I attended the ISWG (Interlocal Stormwater Work Group) on July 17th. ISWG is the Cumberland County's MS4 group along with a few northern York County City municipalities such as, Biddeford, Saco, and Old Orchard Beach. I'll start attending their meetings because I think it's important to work with other MS4's in the State. In the future I'd like to attend a Bangor and Lewiston area meeting.

MS4 MINIMUM CONTROL MEASURES:

Public Education & Outreach on Stormwater Impacts:

We had a micro burst on July 15/16. An announcement was placed on Channel 3 and in the York Weekly reminding folks about not placing leaves and branches in drainage ditches.

Public Involvement & Participation:

Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination:

On July 16th, after a micro burst and heavy rain, officials from EPA, Dr. Steve Jones (UNH), Kevin Lewis of DPW, and I spent a good part of the day taking water samples. This was a pre-arranged sampling date to follow-up on EPA's previous water sampling in 2012 & 2013. Dr. Jones and EPA will process the samples they took in their respective labs. I took my samples to the lab the Town uses in Kennebunk. The results will be shared by the

parties and it will be interesting to see the results. This round of testing focused on the catch basins directly upstream from pipes draining onto the beaches.

The Non-Stormwater (Illicit) Discharge Ordinance went before the Board of Selectmen for their first Public Hearing on July 28, 2014. The Board voted 5-0 to move the Ordinance forward to the Second Public Hearing on August 25th.
