MS4 Permit Requirements and Meetings for April:

- York County MS4 Group met on April 16, 2014, with each town giving an update. Dean and I discussed the meeting we had with EPA in March. The Ducky Ads have been running since March and end this month. They will run again the last two weeks of May and September. The Ads are on the Town website under Stormwater/MS4. The group agreed to address Coal Tar Sealant as our Targeted Outreach for the Priority Watersheds in each town. We will be working with the Casco Bay Interlocal Stormwater Working Group on this, the state legislature will be the target audience.
- A meeting was held at the York Sewer District to discuss Illicit Discharge and Detection Elimination (IDDE), review the age of the Town's sewer system, and any known cross connections. In attendance were Kristie Rabasca, Brett Horr, Tim Haskell, Mike Tibbetts, and me. Dean Lessard was a no show. Kristie will set up another meeting with Dean to go over what was discussed since he's one the key players.

MS4 MINIMUM CONTROL MEASURES:

Public Education & Outreach on Stormwater Impacts:

The April 10th yardscaping workshop held in Kittery had a low attendance, about 3 people. The next workshop is scheduled for May 7th in South Berwick. Hope there's a better turnout. The 3rd workshop will be held in York at Hutchins House Ornamental Grasses. Master Gardener, Allan Amioka will give the presentation. There will be handouts available to the public. Since York is doing Lawns to Lobsters for its yard care program, Allan will mention it in his presentation. The other communities are using the State's Yardscaping program.

Public Involvement & Participation:

Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination:

Two failed septic systems were found this month in the Urbanized Area and one cross connection.

Amber and I did a site visit to Anthony's Food Shop and found evidence of a possible septic systems malfunction. Amber contacted the owner and he is working with a site evaluator to correct the issue. The other is at the Beach Post Office. The building owner will be tying into public sewer within the next few weeks since the Sewer District is currently installing sewer line in that area.

The one cross connection is located in the Harbor at the Milbury Pump Station. The Sewer District is aware of it and will be correcting it in the very near future.

Draft Non-Stormwater (Illicit) Discharge Ordinance will go before the Planning Board on May 22, 2014 for the first Public Hearing.

Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control:

There are currently no projects with soil disturbance greater than 1 acre.

Post-Construction Stormwater Management (New and Redevelopment):

Draft Post-Construction Stormwater Management Ordinance will go before the Planning Board May 22, 2013 for the first Public Hearing.
