MS4 Permit Requirements and Meetings:

York County MS4 Group met on May 20th. David Ladd (DEP) discussed how audits were going, and the best one so far has been Biddeford. DEP has audits schedule out as far as November, with Kittery and South Berwick schedule in September and October. The annual reports are due September 15th so DEP will hold off scheduling any more audits until after January 2016.

Kristie handed out a spreadsheet of items she will need for the group's annual report. York has a few last minute items to be submitted such as the street sweeping list and number of catch basins cleaned. This information will be collected from DPW in July.

MS4 MINIMUM CONTROL MEASURES:

Public Education & Outreach on Stormwater Impacts:

The Portland area group, ISWG, and York County MS4 Group worked together on a coal tar fact sheet as part of our outreach. The fact sheet was submitted to the legislative Environmental and Natural Resource Committee and other legislators. Bill LC 1208 "An Act Concerning Pavement Sealing Products" was heard before the committee on April 23, 2015. It did not fare well, and the two groups will regroup next year and submit the documents.

Public Involvement & Participation:

Kristie has reached out to Eldredge Lumber asking if they would be willing to host a workshop for Lawns to Lobsters. They agreed and a date was set for June 4th.

I began IDDE source tracking on May 18th per our letter to EPA on March 6th. I performed dry weather monitoring from May 18th through May 23rd. Samples taken on the first day at the only two locations that had water flowing. They were the wetland off Sea Rose Lane and at the out fall at the base of the Nubble below the Cutty Sark. Water samples results showed no bacteria. The next round of monitoring will be in June in the Short Sands area.
