### MS4 Permit Requirements and Meetings for November:

- York County MS4 Group: No meeting in November
- Targeted Best Management Practices Plan for York County MS4 Group submitted to MDEP on November 1, 2013
- Consultant Kristie Rabasca and I attended a Board of Selectmen Meeting on November 18<sup>th</sup>. Kristie did a 15 minute presentation on the Stormwater Program Management Plan. It was recommended that the Board authorized the Town Manager to sign the Certification for the Plan, which they did.
- Technical Review Committee Meeting on November 19<sup>th</sup>. Representatives from York Water, Sewer, Public Works, Police and Planning were in attendance. I gave an overview of 2 ordinances being drafted for November 2014, and the 3 plans required under the MS4 General Permit. As these are completed and/or approved, they will be posted on the MS4 website.

### *MS4 MINIMUM CONTROL MEASURES:*

#### Public Education & Outreach on Stormwater Impacts:

A table and display was set-up at the polls on November 5<sup>th</sup> at the York High School to promote Lawns to Lobsters. This was the final event raffling off the lawn mower. The winning ticket belonging to Abby Philbrook, was picked by the Town Clerk/Tax Collector, Mary-Anne Szeniewski on November 8<sup>th</sup>.

#### Public Involvement & Participation:

The Town hosted 3<sup>rd</sup> grade classes from Coastal Ridge Elementary. In the past they've done basic mapping of the Town of York. This year Amber and Leslie had the students map their watershed address. This tracks water falling on the Coastal Ridge playground and following it to the Atlantic Ocean.

#### Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination:

With the cooperation of all 6 properties owners, dye testing, sewer pipe inspections, and property inspections have been completed in CNR-6. No sign of dye over a period of 2 months, and no sign of a malfunctioning septic system was found.

Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control:

There are currently no projects with soil disturbance greater than 1 acre.

Post-construction Stormwater Management (New and Redevelopment):

Currently working on erosion and sediment control measures for November 2014.

Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations:

None scheduled for November.
