Topics Discussed:

1. Event Schedule

- Bike Rodeo at Coastal Ridge: May 10 3:30 set-up; 5:30 – 7:30 rodeo
- Family bike Ride: May 13 10:00-11:00 York High School to Village elementary
- Bike and Pedestrian Safety Education: CRES during school (Leah and Rich Johnston)

2. Library public workshop: a workshop is being considered in conjunction with the York Public Library to provide a forum for community input on bicycle and pedestrian safety issues. The format would be a brief introduction and then stations where participants can record issues and suggestions for improving accessibility and safety for walkers and bike riders in York. Dave will discuss with Library staff for scheduling.

3. Public Works Update: Dean Lessard provided an update on DPW projects in process and scheduled for the near future.

- Long Beach Seawall/sidewalk: Work is ongoing and hope t complete from Bathhouse to Sun and Surf if weather cooperates. This will include an American Disability Act (ADA) compliant ramp. The step design worked very well during the last storm. The seawall/sidewalk improvements will continue as approved on future ballots.
- Work will continue on the Nubble Road repaving and sidewalk between Dover Bluffs and 3rd. This work also includes water pipe replacements that will impact schedules. The May ballot will include future bond funding to continue the work from 3rd to Sohier Park.
- The York Village Revitalization project will be advertised for bids in December. Delays due to MDoT issues. Dean will be briefing Selectboard on Feb13.
- Lindsay Road: sidewalk and parking spaces will be added to the road along the burial grounds and up to the York Hospital entrance.
- Moulton Lane: A sidewalk will be added on the east side of Moulton. The openings (necks) at both ends of the Lane will be narrowed to slow traffic entering the neighborhood. The Water District will be replacing piping prior to repaving.
- Additional paving projects will be undertaken based on road condition assessment that are being conducted.

4. Approval of Minutes: Minutes for the November meeting were approved and will be submitted for posting on the Town website.
