Connectivity: Expand Transportation Options

- Prioritize new development that minimizes the need for vehicles.
- Make access management plans for Rt. 1, Short Sands Road, Ridge Road, York Street.
- Adopt Complete Streets Policy.
- Calm traffic with bump-outs and speed humps.
- Make different design standards between rural roads and Town roads.
- Introduce roundabouts.
- Make roads bicycle friendly. Make an inventory of sidewalks, trails, and bike lanes.
- Create a transportation hub. Transportation center in Green Enterprise Zone?
- Have a shuttle bus for parking at the High School for beaches.
- What is it with a “taxi ban”? This will be studied.
- What are the issues about prohibiting skateboarding? Can skateboarding be allowed during a limited season?
- Fill sidewalk gaps on Rte 1.
- Make policy for culs-de-sac and private roads.

Connectivity: Expand Digital Connectivity in York

- Explore opportunities for broadband, cellular, Wifi.
- Address cell service—5G?
- Have DPW install Wifi as it expands new projects.
- Have a Communications Committee.
- Provide technical education and support for older adults

Connectivity: Expand Social Connectivity in York

- Create small, unused, popup, social gathering places.

- Create a broader series of community events that include arts and culture.
- Popularize community events like Harvestfest.
- Televisе York Community Auditorium events.
- Expand newsletters for Town Parks & Rec, Center for Active Living, and Adult Education.
- Multi-generational community center

Optimize resources and capacity for recreation, social activities and programming

- Loosen up the process of reserving meeting spaces.
- Make parking pass usage allowable at obscure Town locations during inactive hours (e.g., Center for Active Living).
- Identify community spaces like parks for gatherings.
- Incorporate Universal Design Standards in more public places.

History and Archeology

- Create a comprehensive inventory of historic landmarks.
- Partner with Old York. Seek funding and support.
- Create categories for landmarks.
- How many years cover “historic”?
- Identify criteria to protect “non-historical” buildings.
