The Maine Turnpike Authority would like to make you aware of an upcoming project near you. Later this year the MTA will be constructing two emergency vehicle access ramps near the Mountain Road Bridge that carries traffic over the mainline of the Maine Turnpike.

These ramps will be gated and primarily used by Maine Turnpike Authority maintenance vehicles and snow plows, but will also be available for other emergency vehicles, such as the Fire Department or Police Department, when needed. The ramps will only be used by the authorized vehicles mentioned above and will not be open to the general public.

Once the contract has been awarded, we will reach out to you again to give you information about the construction schedule.

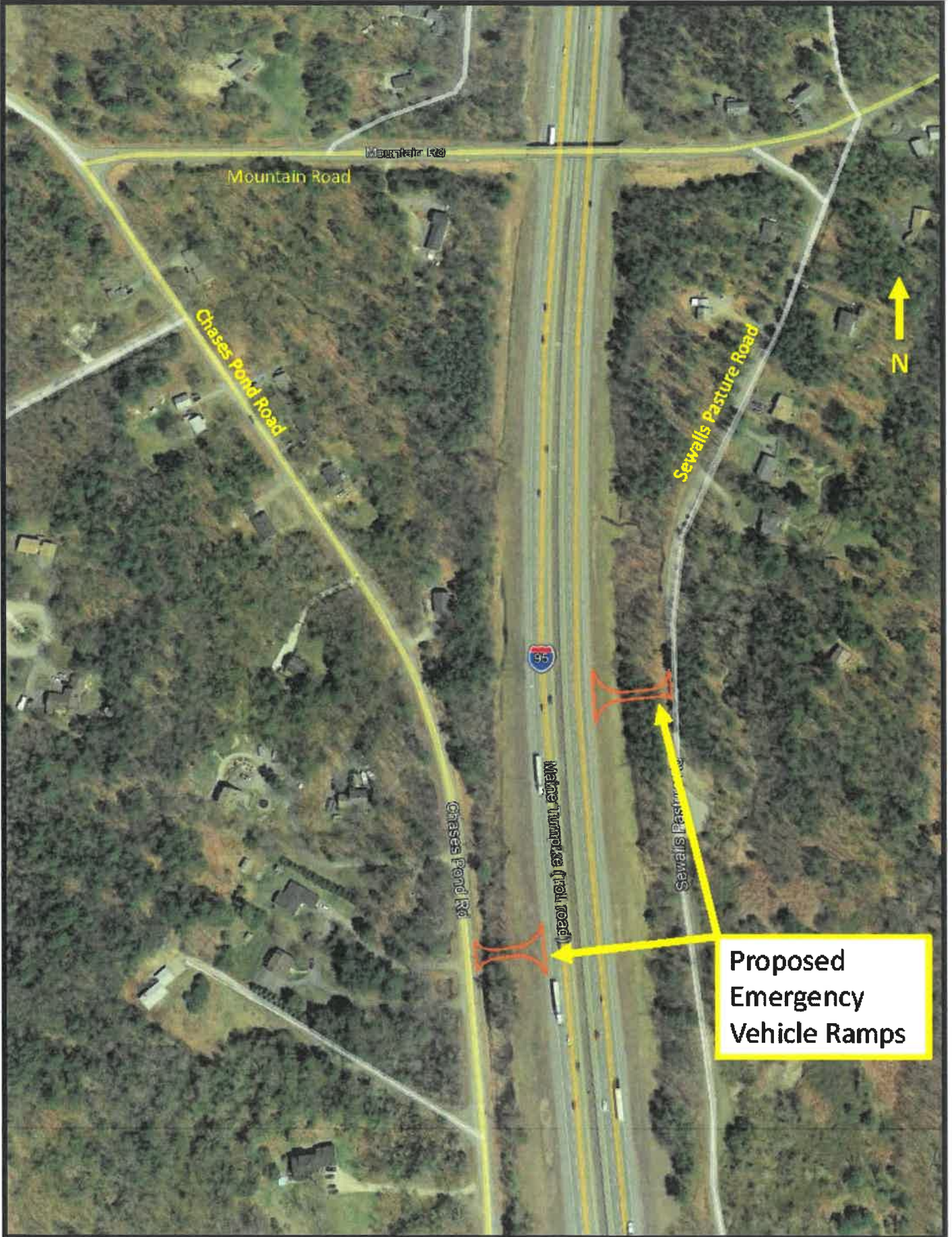
In the meantime, on the back of this letter is a map showing where the ramps will be located. If you have any questions regarding the proposed project please feel free to contact us either by phone or email.
